

## Rural Health Services Research Network of BC (RHSRNbc) Funding for FLEX Projects


The Rural Health Services Research Network of BC (RHSRNbc) was established in May 2010, as part of an overall strategy to improve and expand health services research within British Columbia. The RHSRNbc's main purpose is to support rural health services' researchers in British Columbia, with the goal of creating a supportive infrastructure within which to facilitate the investigation of issues relevant to the health and health services of rural communities.

Flex funding will be awarded to year 1, 2 and 4 FLEX students who are working in projects that involve rural and remote health activities. Year 1, 2 and 4 bursaries are up to a maximum of \$1000 each. These bursaries are intended to subsidize the costs associated with working on a rural health project remotely. Allowable expenses may include: costs associated with Online learning support, data analysis software, other technology costs, honorariums etc. Funds will be reimbursed after submission of original receipts and final report for RHSRNbc.

Minimum Requirements and Expectations:

- 1 Projects involve rural and remote health activities in British Columbia
- 2 Projects must have been approved by FLEX Advisor
  - Provide evidence that the project supervisor is connected and/or is part of a rural community
- Students must submit a final copy of their related FLEX Project Report to RHSRNbc at the completion of their project describing the work completed, impact of their work and their overall experience conducting research in rural settings
- 5 Prepare short blurb about the project that can be included in RHSRNbc newsletters and/or website and/or social media platforms\*
- 6 Provide permission for project description and information to be publicized on website, newsletter and/or social media and shared with funders\*

\*If this is an issue for privacy matters, please provide explanation. This can be discussed on a case-by-case basis.


