# **Featured Post**

Building resilient rural communities: Understanding mental health impacts of climate change events



### Background

Mental health affects many Canadians. Climate change and climate change events (CCEs) significantly influence mental health and wellbeing. Furthermore, CCEs impact rural and remote communities disproportionately. Goal: To foster community resilience through a deeper understanding of the mental health impacts of CCEs. Methods: Community consultations with health and social care providers, community organization representatives, and community members in 3 communities located across the university geographies. Deliberative dialogue with key stakeholders in each community to co-create solutions to foster resilience. Impacts: Contribute to the development of a community-based action plan for mental health supports related to CCEs in rural communities.

# **Funding Opportunities**

#### Rural physician research grants

The Rural Physician Research Support Project is a new initiative that supports rural physicians to pursue innovative rural research and knowledge translation that contributes to advancing rural health in BC. Eligible rural physician-researchers can receive research grants of up to \$10,000.

Deadline: October 31, 2020

#### Rural global health partnership initiative

The Rural Global Health Partnership Initiative (RGHPI) is a new program that supports partnerships between BC physicians or medical trainees committed to rural service, and lower resource communities in BC, Canada, and developing countries.

Deadline: October 31, 2020

### New Frontiers in Research Fund (NFRF)

The Exploration grants, funded by the government of Canada, fund high-risk, high-

reward interdisciplinary research

Deadline: October 20, 2020.

### Sue Harris Family Practice Research Grant

The Sue Harris Family Practice Research Grant supports research that contributes to women's (cis and trans-inclusive) health within the discipline of family practice. The funding is intended to support new researchers (family practice residents and/or practitioners) to develop and carry out a pilot research project.

Deadline: August 26, 2020.

### RCC's New Rural Physician CME Program

Beginning January 1, 2020, the New Rural Physician CME Program will offer funding for new rural physicians to attend rurally-relevant events.

### REAP's Rural Leadership Development Program

We are currently accepting applications from rural physicians who are pursuing formalized leadership training. In addition to funding up to \$15,000 to cover expenses, participants are offered a mentoring opportunity with a rural leader.

Deadline: October 31, 2020.
