FLEX Project Bursary

The RHSRNbc fund travel bursaries to be awarded to year 1, 2 and 4 FLEX students working on projects involving rural and remote health activities. However, due to the unintended consequences of COVID-19, these bursaries are intended to subsidize the costs associated with working remotely on a rural health project.
