The Rural Global Health Partnership Initiative (RGHPI) is a new program that supports partnerships between BC physicians or medical trainees committed to rural service, and lower resource communities in BC, Canada, and developing countries. The Climate Emergency: Diagnosis and Management (Oct 30, 2020)

The World Health Organization has stated that the climate crisis is the biggest health concern of the 21st century--and the Lancet has said that fighting climate change could be the greatest global health opportunity. If we do not make major changes to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the next 10 years, the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) predicts catastrophic effects on the environment and human health.
