#### Hello RHSRNbc members!

The days are getting longer, and hopefully everyone's busy springs are winding down for easy yet productive summers. May was certainly full for the Network - especially our educational endeavors! Educational Committee Chair, Dr. Jude Kornelsen kicked things off by participating on the research partnerships panel for Island Health's Five Days in May, as well as facilitating a workshop on strategic grant-writing. Next, Dr. Grzybowski, Director of the RHSRNbc, gave a workshop titled "Developing your Research Project from the Ground-Up" at the RCCbc's annual Rural Emergency Continuum of Care Conference in Penticton, where the Network also exhibited. It was great to see some of you at RECC!

I also wanted to share this neat online tool I found, <u>Project Big Life</u>. By filling out a simple survey, it gives a rough estimate of your life expectancy, expected hospital usage, as well as a look at your sodium intake patterns. Once you have your calculation, you can even go back and see how changing certain lifestyle habits can affect your outcomes. I took the survey, and found that based on my current lifestyle, my life expectancy is 95.8 years (yay!), with an expected 17 days spent in hospital. I'm also well within the recommended sodium intake range! This seems like a useful tool to communicate the real-world effects that lifestyle can have, and I can tell you that it is quite encouraging.

### 2014 Childhood and Adolescent Obesity

This conference brings together an interdisciplinary group of professionals and policy makers working in the field of childhood and adolescent obesity. The 5th conference will focus on the burden of obesity among Indigenous Youth and particularly on the strengths youth. This theme will address a major gap in our understanding of the role that resiliency plays in the prevention and management of obesity. Through presentations from Indigenous youth living in communities with a high burden of obesity, sharing circles with Indigenous leaders and stakeholders and presentations from experts, the conference will turn the discussion to the strengths of Indigenous youth. Additionally, we will explore interventions designed to promote these strengths and enhance resiliency among children and adolescents.

## **Funding Opportunities**

### **RHSRNbc Travel Bursary Competition**

The RHSRNbc offers four bursaries--three national bursaries of up to \$450, and one international bursary of \$750-to subsidize the cost of travel, accommodation, and other expenses related to conference participation. Bursaries are awarded to RHSRNbc members who have been invited to present their rural health services research orally or as a poster at either a national or international conference. ### **CIHR Operating Grant: Population Health Intervention Research**

Deadline for application is <u>Sept 9, 2014</u> The purpose of this funding opportunity is to support population health intervention research on timely population health interventions. For this funding opportunity, eligible population health interventions are "natural experiments" defined as programs, policies and resource distribution approaches that have been initiated by others (e.g., policy makers) and have the potential to impact health and health equity at the population level.
